

Alcoholism and binge drinking are serious problems here in Mozambique. Among the vile, cheap and lethal spirits sold – those with high alcohol content and low price, guaranteed to hit you like a punch from Rumble in the Jungle - the most popular is Tentação (which means temptation, in Portuguese), less than US\$1 for half a pint. Other brands are Lord Gin, Double Punch, Boss, Rhino and Paradise. The cheapest, Lord Gin, with 43% alcohol, costs US\$1 for half a liter.

Though underage drinking is technically illegal here, no one seems to check.

Mercedes Sayagues is a Knight International Journalism Fellow who is building a network of health journalists in Mozambique with the skills to produce regular coverage of life-threatening diseases and health challenges. She created the first-ever health section at the influential weekly *Savana*, which features stories on issues such as AIDS, cholera and maternal mortality.

She is a journalist, media trainer and researcher who specializes in HIV and AIDS, health, gender, human rights and humanitarian issues. She is fluent in English, Spanish, Portuguese, French and Italian.

A South Africa-based media trainer and freelance journalist, Sayagues was chief editor of the Web-based information service *PlusNews*' Portuguese service from 2005 to 2008. Supported by the UN, *PlusNews* is the largest source of news about HIV/AIDS in Africa. Sayagues built the news service, identified and trained a network of correspondents, edited their stories and produced her own, managed the Web site, published a quarterly magazine, oversaw production of rip-and-read radio programs, produced a training manual on reporting on AIDS, and developed partnerships with AIDS actors in Angola, Mozambique, Cape Verde, Guinea Bissau and São Tomé and Príncipe.

She was a freelance journalist based in Zimbabwe during the critical 1994-2001 period, reporting for South Africa's *Mail & Guardian*, along with other news organizations.

Nigeria: Create New Health Section at Daily Trust newspaper

Sunday Dare is launching a health section at *The Daily Trust*, the most widely read newspaper in northern Nigeria. He is creating new online resources on the paper's website, including information on health services and a comprehensive database of health experts. Working with Freedom Radio in Kano, he also is starting a health program in an area where misinformation caused people to refuse polio vaccines, leading to an increase in polio cases.

Dare is an award-winning investigative reporter, multimedia journalist and media trainer with more than two decades of experience in the United States and Nigeria. He spent eight years at the Voice of America in Washington, D.C., where he headed the Hausa-language service that broadcast to more than 24 million listeners in West Africa. At VOA, he managed a multi-year health journalism project that used news programming, town hall meetings and radio dramas to improve public understanding of malaria, measles and polio.



Through a new health journalism association, Knight International Health Journalism Fellow Sunday Dare has begun a year-long fellowship through ICFJ to improve both the quantity and quality of health reporting in Nigeria.

David Tolbert was appointed president of the International Center for Transitional Justice in March of 2010. Previously he served as registrar (assistant secretary-general) of the Special Tribunal for Lebanon and prior to that was assistant secretary-general and special expert to the United Nations secretary-general on United Nations Assistance to the Khmer Rouge Trials.

From 2004 to 2008 Mr. Tolbert served as deputy chief prosecutor of the International Criminal Tribunal for the former Yugoslavia (ICTY). He had previously been the deputy registrar of the ICTY and at an earlier time served at the ICTY as chef de cabinet to President Gabrielle Kirk McDonald and Senior Legal Adviser, Registry, serving a total of 9 years at the ICTY.

From 2000 to 2003 Mr. Tolbert held the position of executive director of the American Bar Association's Central European and Eurasian Law Initiative, which manages rule-of-law development programs throughout Eastern Europe and the former Soviet Union. He also held the position of chief, General Legal Division of the United Nations Relief Works Agency in Vienna, Austria, and Gaza. In addition Mr. Tolbert taught international law and human rights at the post-graduate level in the United Kingdom and practiced law for many years in the United States.

David Tolbert was Jennings Randolph Senior Fellow at the United States Institute of Peace and served as a member of the American Society of International Law Task Force on United States Policy Toward the International Criminal Court (ICC) during 2008 and 2009. He has a number of publications on international criminal justice, the ICTY, and the ICC, in the Harvard Human Rights Journal, The Fletcher Forum of World Affairs, and other journals and books. Mr. Tolbert frequently lectures and makes public appearances on





Family planning experts from USAID, UNFPA, WHO, the International Planned Parenthood Federation (IPPF), and 14 nongovernmental and private organizations met on July 9-10, 2012, ahead of the landmark [London Summit on Family Planning](#), to review evidence around [high-impact practices in family planning](#) (HIPs).

Meeting at UNFPA headquarters in New York, the participants discussed evidence on eight specific practices that, when scaled up and institutionalized, will maximize investments in family planning programs:

- Provide family planning counseling and services at the same time and location where women receive treatment for complications related to abortion. Many postabortion clients have a clear need and demand for family planning, and strong evidence demonstrates that providing family planning services at the same time and location where women receive postabortion treatment is feasible, acceptable, and effective.
- Train, equip, and support community health workers (CHWs) to provide a wide range of contraceptive methods. CHWs can be an important means of reducing inequities in access to services, especially in areas where individuals face physical and social barriers to health services.



- Explored the current family planning/reproductive health (FP/RH) knowledge management system;
- Examined the available resources and opportunities at different levels of the health system;
- Identified areas for improvement; and
- Provided informed suggestions.

In addition, the study employed a relatively new social network analysis and presentation tool, **Net-Map**, which assisted in the analysis and visual presentation of the data.

The study was conducted in Oromia, Amhara, Afar (regional level) and Debreberhan, Gondar, Arsi, and Awash (zonal/woreda levels). There were a total of 17 individual interviews, 4 group interviews, and 2 focus group discussions. The Net-Map methodology was used to explore the family planning and reproductive health (FP/RH) information exchange network and its influencing factors.

Findings showed a shortage in skilled staff in the FP/RH arena, lack of familiarity with national policy and strategy documents, and confusion regarding the authority of RH actors—for example, participants were confused about which organizations had direct authority over others, and to whom organizations should submit reports on RH activities.

The paper on the Ethiopia needs assessment results has been accepted for presentation at the American Public Health Association ([APHA's annual meeting](#)) to be held in San Francisco, CA, USA, in October 2012.
