

I extended Drupal core using a module from contrib.




Nodes, and Entities, and Fields oh my!




### Name that Module

There's about **1.6 billion modules** here's how you find the ones that don't suck.


**#1**: Ask someone you trust


**#2**: Search drupal.org and order by **most installed**. Popular modules tend to be popular because they work.





#### Keeping your code up-to-date


There is no harm in missing a *point release* as long as you understand what you're missing.

Remember to turn on update notifications

# Point release upgrades are **not** rocket surgery.

You don't have to test everything just the things that have to work







You don't need to be an expert, but it'll help a lot to have a basic understanding. After you learn PHP, stay far far away from **PHP.module** 


# Don't. Hack. Core.

Read and understand **theme()** and the related workflow.

## Filters affect permissions

To the point that you won't be able to edit a node that you created and it'll be really confusing.


